The Swiss Club has two members who are docents at this great place and so we can offer a special arrangement for the Swiss Club!

HILLWOOD is located in downtown Washington DC on 4155 Linnean Avenue, not far from the Swiss Embassy. It was the estate of **M**arjorie **M**erriweather **P**ost, the Post cereal heiress. She died in 1973 and left her mansion as a house museum with her wonderful collection of *French art of the 18th and 19th century and a huge collection of Russian art of the 19th century*.

It is a hidden secret in Washington and a wonderful place to spend a Sunday afternoon in June.

We will meet at 12:45pm in the Visitor Center and start at 1pm with the movie about MMP and Hillwood. At 1:30pm we will have a guided tour through the mansion (or a self guided tour if you prefer). On our way to the café we will have time to stroll through the wonderful gardens. The Royal Tea will be served at 3pm.

His return visit to the Old Country seeing with his daughter the old family farm house and reminiscing with his nephew about departed family members brought tears to the corner of his eyes (and also to many of us who have been through similar circumstances). It was a great evening for which we thank the board. The open bar and popcorn created the right atmosphere and helped fuel the socializing before and after the presentation.
