

Swiss National Day Celebration

August 2, 2008 – The sun shone brightly on the Swiss Embassy Grounds, gently warming the rolling Embassy grounds and over 600 Swiss Club members and friends of Switzerland who attended this year's National Day Celebration held on August 2, 2008. Passing thunderstorms could not dampen the joyous festivities and



enthusiasm. Indeed, the intermittent rain brought welcome relief from the high summer heat. After a short respite and cheerful huddling underneath shared umbrellas until the showers passed, activities commenced with renewed vigor.

Along with well proven favorites, this year's National Day Celebration featured a revised layout and particularly compelling raffle and tomobola prizes. Once again, the pool was open and offered a cool oasis and splash opportunities. Children's activities included a moon bounce and face painting, as well as paintyour-own tote bags and other crafts. 
