### **SWISS BENEVOLENT SOCIETY**

The Swiss Benevolent Society of Washington (SBS) will be celebrating its 150th Anniversary next year. Founded in 1865, it is the oldest Swiss organization in Washington. There are several Swiss benevolent groups in other parts of the country. Some have functioned almost like insurance companies, where members pay dues and can get assistance when special needs arise. The SBS's sole mission was and continues to be to help Swiss in need. It was established as a membership organization with the yearly dues of \$3.00 (\$45 in today's Dollars). In some cases travel assistance was extended to individuals who visited or migrated to the United States, and for various reasons had to return back home. Others needed short-term financial assistance, while some needy elderly and sick were visited and helped with medical and dental expenses, and grocery gift cards. In many cases a loan was given, with the expectation that the money would be paid back, but at times some loans were forgiven.

In 1980 the membership of around 100 voted to change from a membership organization to an entity managed by a Board of Trustees. This has been the structure since then. Board members are chosen from other Washington-based Swiss organizations. The same year a scholarship program was initiated to help Swiss and descendants of Swiss with the ever increasing cost of college education. Eligibility to apply for grants has been extended to Swiss descendants of the tiny West Virginia community of Helvetia.

The Board of Trustees is pleased to announce the 2014 award recipients. They are: Noelle Brahimi, this year's Monique Fürst-Price Honorary Scholarship recipient (Virginia Tech Graduate School); Emily Biggs (West Virginia Wesleyan College); Joel Cox (University of Maryland); Shannon Hall (University of Maryland; and Andrea Zemp (University of Maryland). We wish them all a successful and productive school year. The Board of Trustees extends the Swiss Washington community our sincerest appreciation for its continued support.
