Swiss Club Shooting Day results

On a cold Sunday in October some 40+ members and their guests arrived at Thurmont to take part in a friendly shooting competition. The Swiss Rifles were ready for us and advised everyone needing help how to go about aiming for the target.

In addition, Cowboy Hermann Anton and his son had set up some metal targets nearby. As for the scoring, no fancy electronics were necessary there. The result was immediate: there was an audible "ping" when you hit the target and silence when you didn't!

In the 50 yd small caliber, six best out of a first series of ten shots onto a standard target where 10 is the center, that was the rule of this competition. Fortunately, inside the 10, there is an even smaller circle with an X (called "mouche" in French), so the ranking could be based on the number of X's.



In the 300 yard rifle competition with the same rules, coming close to the maximum of 60 was a bit more difficult, as the center 10 of the Swiss standard target A10 is only 10 centimeters (a little more than 4 inches) in diameter.
