

Quiz

Answer to the June Quiz:

The five topics of the June 5, 2016 vote:

- 1. The "Pro public service" initiative demanded that the Confederation and affiliated companies such as Swisscom, Swiss Post or the SBB should not seek financial gain in the provision of public services, should not cross-subsidise other areas and pursue no fiscal interests. Rejected by 67%.
- 2. The "Unconditional basic income" initiative asked that the federal government would pay a certain amount of money to every person living in Switzerland, regardless of their income and assets. The initiative required a change of the Constitution and did neither specify the size of this unconditional basic income nor the means of financing it. This was rejected by 76.9%.
- 3. The initiative "for fairer transport funding" called for the full revenue generated by the mineral oil tax to be spent on road traffic, i. e. including the half that is currently used to fund other federal tasks. Rejected by 70.8%.
- 4. An amended Reproductive Medicine Act allowing pre-implantation genetic diagnosis if the parents are carriers of serious genetic diseases or if they cannot bear children naturally was challenged by referendum fearing an ethically unacceptable increase in tests conducted on human embryos. The referendum did not carry and the amended Act was accepted with 62.4%.
- 5. An amendment to the existing Asylum Act to speed up processing asylum applications (to less than 140 days in the majority of cases) was challenged by referendum, critical of proposed free legal aid to asylum seekers and simplified approval procedures for establishing federal asylum centers. The referendum did not carry and the amended law was accepted with 66.8%.

July Quiz: The British just voted to exit the European Union (EU), which they joined in 1973, exiting another European Trade Association (EFTA), which exists since 1960. What are the relations of Switzerland to EFTA and EU? Hint
