

"A Native Plant Oasis in the Heart of Washington

For those who have missed the previous mentions we've made about our own Ambassador Pitteloud and his birding activities, never fear, he's made the news again! This time featured in the National Audobon Society, the article highlights Ambassador Pittleoud's efforts to create hospitable environments for native and threatened wildlife in the DC region.

"[Ambassador Pittleoud has] been on a mission to rewild the expansive grounds, aiming to create a biodiversity reserve marked by the native plants of the region. He forbid the use of pesticides and allowed the lawn to grow out in spotty patches. Using resources such as Audubon's native plants



database and guide to birds, he worked closely with a local landscape designer, Aldertree Garden, that specializes in native plants. They uprooted all the nonnative bushes and trees, such as ornamental burning bush and non-productive grass, and replaced them with meadows, bushes, and native trees, including white oak, scarlet oak, black oak, and others."


June 28, 1939 - August 22, 2021
