Campbell Graeub

Campbell Graeub passed away on February 8th, at Sibley Memorial Hospital, surrounded by his family. Campbell served as Swiss Club president from 1976-1978, but many will remember his longtime commitment to the Swiss community as Swiss Benevolent Society President. Those who knew Campbell know how much the Club and the local community meant to him. We will always be grateful for his steadfast support and participation during the past half-century. Christian Haudenschild

May 5, 1939 - January 26, 2024

Christian Haudenschild passed away in Lachen, Switzerland, where he had been living with his wife, Changting, for the past several years. Many will remember the former Swiss Club president for his enthusiasm at events and active presence in the community for decades. Christian often remarked that he had been a part of every Swiss group in the region, as a much loved member of the Swiss Benevolent Society, Swiss American Historical Society,



Swiss Rifles, Jass, Folklore, and Drum and Fife groups, as well as making multiple appearances at Stauffacherin luncheons as the featured pianist. Always ready with a warm welcome, his enthusiasm and dedication to the Club and the community were undoubtedly responsible for many of the strong friendships today. He will be greatly missed by his countless friends and beloved family.



Leo Schelbert Prize in History

The Leo Schelbert Prize is awarded to the best submitted undergraduate or graduate research paper. The topic can be anything that relates to the mission of the Swiss American Historical Society (SAHS), which focuses on increasing an understanding of Swiss and/or Swiss-American history.

Dr. Leo Schelbert was an historian and professor emeritus at the University of Illinois-Chicago who died in 2022 at age 93. Dr. Schelbert was born in Kaltbrunn, Canton St. Gallen in 1929. He got his PhD from Columbia University and taught at the University of Illinois from 1971-2003. Dr. Schelbert focused on Swiss emigration history, writing several books and an encyclopedia about Switzerland. Over five decades, he served as SAHS President (1975-1980) and was otherwise involved with publications as Editor-in-Chief, Co-Editor of the *SAHS Review* and member of the editorial board for book publications. A great mentor and friend to many, he helped to ensure that the Swiss American Historical Society would grow and endure for years to come.
